# You Said, We Did:

YOU SAID: Anti-Social Behaviour at Wykin Park

**WE DID:** Calls were received regarding alleged drug dealing and Anti-Social behaviour. Police Officers attended and persons involved dealt with accordingly. The Beat Team are still in regular contact with partners at Hinckley & Bosworth Borough Council and Leicester City Council to discuss cost effective solutions, with the view to a potential solution being agreed in early 2022. Patrols have been increased in the area and local residents given reassurance.

YOU SAID: Shoplifting

**WE DID:** Shoplifters over the period up to Christmas have been targeted by Hinckley Beat Team in partnership with Hinckley & Bosworth Borough Council CCTV and Hinckley BID Retail Radio. The success of the operation has been fantastic with lots of perpetrators being detained and stolen property recovered and returned to the stores involved. The proactive use of both plain clothes, uniformed officers and CCTV has made the identification of offenders and them being caught in the act very effective. Hinckley town centre has proven to be a 'no go area 'for anyone wanting to steal items without paying for them!

# This month's feature - COURIER FRAUD

#### IT'S A SCAM.

Its that time of year again when the fraudsters and the pranksters make their debut appearances to fool the best of us. Its so easy to get caught out, even in the comfort of your own home.

## Action Fraud have released a flyer which states the following information: -

A fraudster may phone you claiming to be a police officer or an official from your bank. The caller may sound very genuine. The police or your bank will never ask for your PIN or password details to transfer funds or withdraw cash/valuables for someone to collect.

## Be aware that fraudsters might target you in one of the following ways: -

- 1. Phone calls out of the blue
- 2. Claims to be your bank or police
- 3. Advise you of an issue with your banking
- 4. Sends to courier to collect cash/valuables
