Grant:	Veterans' Foundation Grant
Summary:	Grants are available for organisations which support serving and former members of the British Armed Forces who may be facing challenging circumstances. This can include:  Reducing homelessness.  Increasing employment.  Reducing dependence on alcohol and drugs.  Mental health
Key Eligibility Criteria:	<ul> <li>Priority is given to charities and organisations who can demonstrate that they are directly involved in the provision of support to those in need, as well as well-run organisations of low to medium wealth.</li> <li>Bids for start-up organisations are particularly carefully scrutinised and may not be funded due to the risk involved. If they are funded, the Foundation may require matchfunding arrangements</li> </ul>
Min/Max Funding Available:	Max grant £30,000 (which can be spread over three years)

Grant: Summary:	Armed Forces Covenant Trust – Force for Change Programme *  The funding aims to support community projects that reduce
	isolation and promote integration, supporting post-COVID recovery in local Armed Forces communities.
Key Eligibility Criteria:	<ul> <li>Projects must start within one month of being awarded funding.</li> <li>Registered charities or Community Interest Companies (CIC) wishing to apply must have substantial recent experience of supporting Armed Forces communities and have been registered for at least one year at the time of your application.</li> </ul>

Grant:	LLR Living Well with Dementia Grant Fund
Summary:	The fund supports VCS organisations to work with people living with dementia and their family or informal carers. Grants are awarded in multiples of £500.
Key Eligibility Criteria:	District/town/village/neighbourhood/community specific projects can only apply for grants up to £5,000. Activities or projects need to meet one of the following fund themes:  Improve older people's access to social activity  Reduce feelings of loneliness or isolation in older people  Increase the availability of local projects or activity which supports older people  Respond to local social or economic needs
Key Eligibility Criteria:	<ul> <li>Applying organisations annual income must be less than £250,000</li> <li>Applications must not be more than 25% of the organisation's annual income</li> <li>Funded projects should ideally begin 1<sup>st</sup> September 2022 and MUST be completed by 28<sup>th</sup> February 2023</li> </ul>

Grant:	Getting Help in Neighbourhoods Adult Mental Health and Wellbeing Fund
Summary:	<ul> <li>This fund is to enable local charitable organisations to provide local activities for people aged 18+ that:</li> <li>Build resilience and prevent adult mental health issues from developing or becoming worse</li> <li>Provide more opportunities and places for adults to seek help and support</li> <li>Support adults recovering or living with long-term mental health challenges to live as independently as they can</li> <li>Improve healthy life expectancy and reduces health inequalities</li> </ul>
Key Eligibility Criteria:	<ul> <li>Applying organisations will need to:</li> <li>Demonstrate a commitment to supporting adults that values and promotes their skills, experiences and potential.</li> <li>Be inclusive, promote and celebrate local diversity and use locally accessible venues that help to reduce isolation</li> <li>Develop its staff and volunteers' knowledge about mental health, growing the organisation's confidence to support people with mental health needs.</li> <li>Attend at least one focus group</li> </ul>
Min/Max Funding Available:	Between £3,000 and £50,000
Deadline for Applications:	Round 2 dates TBC (possibly to open by end of May 2022 with a closing date in July 2022)

Grant:	Armed Forces Covenant Fund - Reaching and Supporting Armed Forces Communities Programme *
Summary:	Funding is intended to support projects which are specific and targeted, rather than taking a generalist approach. This could mean supporting a defined group with its own defined needs, or addressing a challenging and pressing need within Armed Forces communities.
Key Eligibility Criteria:	<ul> <li>Applying organisations must be charities and Community Interest Companies (CICs) in the UK which have been registered for a minimum of three years.</li> <li>Applying organisations do not need to be Armed Forcesspecific, but must be willing to work in partnership with Armed Forces organisations.</li> <li>Partnership working is encouraged. Local Authorities, Health Bodies and other organisations not eligible to apply directly could deliver projects in collaboration with an eligible organisation.</li> </ul>
Min/Max Funding Available:	Max £100,000 over 2 years to 3 years (grants over 3 years will be tapered)

Grant:	Thomas Wall Trust – Grants for Registered Charities
Summary:	The grants are for specific projects or core activities that equip disadvantaged people aged 18 and over with the necessary communication skills for employment.  There is particular interest in hearing from groups supporting people experiencing multiple deprivation or major hurdles to employment including women, people with disabilities, refugees and asylum seekers.  The grant can support annual repeat funding for up to three years.

Grant:	Vegetarian for Life - Vegetarian and Vegan Fund
Summary:	The grant fund can support individuals who are vegetarian or vegan, aged over 60 and in financial need (relatively low income or savings) to remain independent. Eligible items include stairlifts, downstairs shower rooms, handrails, other access improvements or short stays in care homes to provide respite for families or carers.
Key Eligibility Criteria:	<ul> <li>To determine eligibility under low income or savings the fund follows the same limits used for eligibility for meanstested state benefits.</li> <li>Grants are awarded on a one-off basis. They are not suitable for ongoing expenditure.</li> </ul>

Grant:	Masonic Charitable Foundation - Later Life Inclusion Grant
Summary:	<ul> <li>Grants (for up to 3 years) are available for local and national charities in England and Wales that are working to reduce loneliness and isolation in older people. Depending on their annual income level, charities can apply for:</li> <li>Small grants, for general running and/or overhead costs of the charity – core funding.</li> <li>Large grants, for projects and can be used for salary costs, activities, materials, etc.</li> </ul>

Min/Max Funding Available:	<ul> <li>Small grants between £1,000 and £5,000 per year for charities with an income of under £500,000.</li> <li>Large grants between £10,000 and £60,000 for charities with an annual income over £500,000.</li> </ul>

## Funding for projects which support Children and Young People

Grant:	<u>Triangle Trust - 1949 Fund</u>
Summary:	<ul> <li>Grants are available for organisations that are working to support young carers/young adult carers to address learning gaps linked to the pandemic. Summary:	<ul> <li>The fund will support organisations to bring social action and youth empowerment opportunities to children and young people, to help prevent or overcome the effects of the disadvantages they face. The fund has a particular interest in:</li> <li>Organisations who focus on addressing issues of disadvantage affecting children and young people</li> <li>Children and young people who have some experience of social action and want to develop their skills and experience to do more.</li> <li>Children and young people who have no experience of social action work at all but want to find out what it is all about.</li> </ul>
Key Eligibility Criteria:	<ul> <li>Projects should:</li> <li>Support young people aged 18 and under</li> <li>Be led by children and young people</li> <li>Be genuinely developmental and reciprocal for children and young people. Providing them with life enhancing experience and new skills and confidence.</li> <li>Application forms are only available to organisations who have attended an information session or have received a recorded session.</li> </ul>

Grant:	Leicestershire Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme  - Summer 2022
Summary:	The Leicestershire Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme is specifically targeted to offer holiday activities to school aged children (5 to 16 years) who are eligible for benefits-related Free School Meals.
	Leicestershire County Council will be awarding funding for HAF holiday provision to Leicestershire schools, charitable, voluntary and community sector organisations and other organisations, who can deliver out of school holiday activities during the Summer school holiday.
Key Eligibility Criteria:	The aim is that the children who attend the provision will be supported:  • to eat more healthily over the school holidays  • to be more active during the school holidays  • to take part in engaging and enriching activities  • to be safe and not to be socially isolated  • to have greater knowledge of health and nutrition  • to be more engaged with school and other local services  To be eligible for HAF funding, applicants must be able to demonstrate that:  • the application for funding is for activities which will be delivered to school-aged children living in Leicestershire  • the provision will be targeted to Leicestershire children eligible for and claiming benefits-related free school meals.  • the activities will be delivered on a not for profit basis
Min/Max Funding Available:	<ul> <li>Standard rate for children eligible for benefits related free school meals:-</li> <li>£20 per place/per day inclusive of £4.00 per place/per day for food = £80 per place/per 4 day week</li> <li>SEND:-</li> <li>£45 per place/per session inclusive of £4 per place/per day for food).</li> <li>Capital:-</li> <li>Limited funding is available for reasonable capital expenditure</li> </ul>

Grant:	BBC Children In Need – We Move Fund
Summary:	The fund will support organisations to bring social action and youth empowerment opportunities to black children and young people, to help prevent or overcome the effects of the disadvantages they face.

Deadline for Applications:	Applicants must register their interest in the fund by 10th June 2022. Applications then need to be submitted by 20th June 2022

Grant:	HM Govt. – Trust Capacity Fund (TCaF) *
Summary:	<ul> <li>The funding is to support the growth and development of Academy Trusts or Local Authority maintained schools in England. There are two strands:</li> <li>A: For projects in which Trusts will take on at least one additional inadequate or requires improvement school from one of the areas listed in <a href="Annexe A of the guidance">Annexe A of the guidance</a></li> <li>B: For all other Trust capacity building projects.</li> </ul>
Key Eligibility Criteria:	<ul> <li>All activities funded by TCaF must start no earlier than 1 April 2022 and be completed by 31 March 2023.</li> <li>Applying organisations must: <ul> <li>Be considered by the Education and Skills Funding Agency to be of sound financial health. As a minimum requirement, applicants must not have an open Financial Notice to Improve</li> <li>Have a record of meeting, or driving improvements in, school standards</li> <li>Have an eligible growth project that has been approved by an RSC between 1 January and 30 June 2022</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
