Proactive work from the team #YouSaidWeDid:

YOU SAID: Safety concerns around Hinckley Train Station

WE DID: Regular visible beat patrols have been undertaken either on foot or in a marked vehicle's during the day and particularly at night in order to ensure the safety of travellers going to board or leaving the trains.

Concerns were raised due to the fact that the area was poorly lit and if You were travelling on your own, felt vulnerable.

This has now been addressed, with no reports of incidents. Patrols will continue in and around the area.

YOU SAID: Inconsiderate parking/speeding vehicles

WE DID: A speeding operation was undertaken by joint teams at Hinckley Police Station, targeting several troublesome locations. It has proven to be successful with 3 drivers reported for speeding, 4 words of advice given, and a speeding vehicle with a smashed windscreen stop checked. Further speeding operations are organised throughout the coming months.

We have also been targeting local Schools due to inconsiderate drivers parking in restricted areas or obstructing residents' driveways. 9 penalty tickets have been issued and warnings given. We are working closely with the Leicester City Council Enforcement Team and have several operations planned over the coming weeks.
