NH25 & NH26 Beat Teams have been actively targeting areas of concern reported by residents of Hinckley this month and of course enjoying the Spring blooms and warmer, longer days!

GREATER HINCKLEY SPEEDING OPERATION

The NH26 Beat Team with Police volunteers and LFRS organised a local speeding operation, targeting Roston Drive, Wheatfield Way and Ashby Rd, Hinckley. The day proved very productive with a number of drivers exceeding the 30mph speed limit and some unbelievably, caught not wearing seatbelts! We were also joined by Councillor David Cope who was passing at the time.

In total, 130 vehicles were speed/seatbelt checked.

All caught were spoken to by Police Officers, given warnings and shown educational videos by our colleagues at LFRS, explaining the dangers and consequences of exceeding speed limits and not wearing seatbelts. We will be organising more speeding operations throughout May.

Proactive work from the team #YouSaidWeDid:

YOU SAID: Concerns regarding increased drug dealing/ASB around Lawnswood and Tame Way.

WE DID: NH26 Beat Team Officers, HBBC ASB Officers and representatives from Derwent Housing (Part of Places for People) did an extensive patch walk in the area, chatting to local residents, listening to their concerns and explain what we collectively are doing to address the issues. All residents spoken to really appreciated the time given and, in the process, offered valuable information. The Beat Team are 'actively' disrupting known perpetrators and targeting areas of concern with increased patrols. We will be working closely with HBBC and Derwent Housing going forward.

YOU SAID: Vehicle causing an obstruction.

WE DID: Residents of the Wykin estate, reported an ongoing issue with a vehicle that had continually caused an obstruction on Beryl Avenue. Despite several visits and warnings given to the owner, it remained in place. Officers had no alternative but to get this removed, with the result being happy neighbours and not so happy owner!
