YOU SAID: Traffic Issues on Butts Lane Hinckley

WE DID:

The continuing issues of inconsiderate parking and speeding during School 'drop off' and 'pick up' times on Butts Lane have been monitored very closely by the local beat team.

Visits and meetings have been held with HAJC/Hinckley Parks and both Traffic Enforcement teams at LCC/Harborough Councils to discuss ways of tackling the problems, with the following acted upon.

- Further letters advising parents about parking on restricted single yellow lines have been sent.
- A Traffic Enforcement vehicle will be making regular trips down Butts lane, photographing and issuing penalty notices to cars parked illegally or causing an obstruction.
- A PCSO/Traffic Enforcement Officer will also be patrolling the area, giving words of advice, warnings and issuing penalty notices.
- Speeding vehicles have been identified and perpetrators contacted accordingly.

This is an ongoing problem as Schools return to normal but we ask all parents to be considerate to local residents and observe the parking restrictions in force. Where possible park away from the area and walk your children to School.

Beat team update – There has been a few changes to the team over the past few months with PCSO Jack March 6572 leaving the beat to train as a regular officer, so it's not goodbye more of an 'Au revoir'! We all wish him the best of luck for the future and PCSO 6080 Kira Young has also moved onto pastures new but no doubt we will see some fresh new faces joining the team in the future.

Proactive work from the team #YouSaidWeDid:

YOU SAID: ASB & Drug dealing at Wykin Park

WE DID:

There has been an increase in Anti-Social Behaviour and Drug dealing at Wykin Park over the past few months with reports of groups of youths meeting late at night in the car park. The aftermath is only too clear to see, boxes of nitrous oxide canisters and balloons left lying around.

The local beat team have met with HBBC to look at ways of making the area a 'no go' destination for the perpetrators. We are currently in discussion, with the options of better lighting, CCTV and barriers. Rest assured the beat

team/HBBC are working tirelessly to come up with a solution that is both affordable and a deterrent.

In the meantime we are regularly patrolling the area, if you see anything suspicious please call 101 or chat with one of our friendly team.

YOU SAID: Drug use and Drug Dealing across Hinckley is an issue.

WE DID: In the last two weeks we have arrested 43 people concerned in buying and selling drugs – known as County Lines. This includes a number of significant individuals who are believed to have been controlling the "County Lines".

A proactive operation began on Monday 20 September and has led to 20 people being charged with drugs offences – from supplying class A and conspiracy to supply class A and class B. Fifteen others remain under investigation with the hard work by the team continuing and more charges are expected.

The police operation, called Operation Impose, has executed 73 warrants, searching 76 addresses. During the operation, officers recovered almost £200,000 in cash, various offensive weapons and around 6kg of heroin with a value in excess of £300,000. Over the next few months we have plans in place to continue to target the people who choose to use or deal drugs.
