This month has been business as usual with your local beat team taking part in Policing operations, beat surgeries, patrolling the streets of Hinckley and responding to incidents being called into us by the public. If you see one of our officers hosting a beat surgery feel free to come up and talk to us about any issues or concerns you may have, you can also buy crime prevention equipment such as locks, alarms and cat bells.

We also welcome Police Community Support Officer 6080 Kira Young to the NH26 Greater Hinckley beat team. If you see Keira out on patrol in Hinckley feel free to welcome her to Hinckley.

This month has seen 308 incidents called in across Hinckley. 9 of which were anti-social behaviour related and 38 were of a serious emergency nature, requiring an urgent grade 1 response.

YOU SAID: Anti-social Behaviour

WE DID:

Considering the school summer holidays were throughout this month we have had a decline in reported anti-social behaviour incidents in comparison to previous months. That does not mean that we are resting! Your local beat team are always out and about in local parks and open spaces in Hinckley providing a policing presence and giving re-assurance to members of the public. If you have any issues or concerns regarding anti-social behaviour and you see one of our officers out on patrol please feel free to come up to us and talk to us about it, or call 101 to speak to our call takers who will log the report.

YOU SAID: Road Safety

WE DID:

We have had complaints and reports of numerous vehicles turning right out of Wheatfield Way onto the A47 when it is a left only turn.

This junction went under changes a number of years ago due to the amount of serious accidents and to breach the 'No Right Turn' is dangerous due to the speed at which vehicles come down the A47.

Officers have recently been deployed to identify offenders and once stopped have initially been providing advice and warnings in an attempt to deter and educate those breaking the law. In the coming weeks our team intends to revisit the location and issue tickets to offending drivers.

Good News

Op Feather – Operation Feather is the continuing operation that has been put in place to ensure our night time economy is a safe place to visit and that incidents of violence, public order and any drug offences are dealt with swiftly and efficiently. A team of officers are deployed to the town centre on foot on Friday and Saturday nights to enable them to respond promptly to issues. In the last month this has led to an arrest of a male for possession with intent to supply class A drugs following partnership work with CCTV. It also enabled officers to be on the scene of the serious collision on Castle Street between a pedestrian and moped, where early enquiries led to a suspect being arrested.

Fatal 4 Op. – On Thursday 19th August 2021 local beat officers teamed up with officers from Leicestershire's traffic unit and hosted a Fatal 4 operation in Hinckley. This involved officers driving in un-marked vehicles on the A5 and observing people breaking traffic laws and dealing with them. There were numerous tickets issued to drivers for speeding, not wearing seatbelts and people being on their phone whilst driving. Throughout the day there was also a van seized under section 165, due to having no insurance, and a section 59 Warning issued to someone who was riding an E-scooter in an anti-social manner.

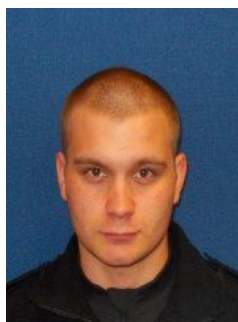
